

WHAT TO BRING TO CAMP

PACKING LIST DRESS CODE: (Reference this when choosing clothing.)

- All shorts, skirts, and dresses must be modest length/fit (Fingertip length when arms are placed at sides.)
- Modest, 1-piece swimsuits only
- Shirts: No tight, cut-off, low-cut, spaghetti straps, or bare midriffs (tummy or back), references to alcohol, tobacco, or other questionable items.
- Shoes and shirts must be worn at all times.
- “When in doubt, leave it out.”

CLOTHING:

Bring extra! We get wet/messy almost every day! Casual clothing/shoes

- Sweatshirt/Jacket (for chilly mornings/evenings)
- Jeans/Sweatpants (for outdoor evening activities)
- Socks/Undergarments
- Pajamas
- Modest 1-piece swimsuit for girls, swim trunks for boys
- Athletic shorts and t-shirts
- Shoes- tennis shoes and closed toe sandals are recommended (bring extra in case they get wet)

BEDDING:

- Sleeping bag
- Twin size sheet (to cover bunk mattress)
- Pillow Additional blanket/sheet (optional but may be cooler than a sleeping bag)

PERSONAL HYGIENE ITEMS:

- Toothpaste
- Toothbrush

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WHAT TO BRING TO CAMP

- Hair brush/Comb
- Deodorant
- Shampoo/Conditioner
- Soap/Body Wash
- Bath towels
- Washcloths
- Shower shoes are recommended for the bathhouse (i.e. flip flops or aqua shoes)

MEDICATIONS:

All medications must be brought in their original containers. The camper's name must be on ALL medication. All medications are to be submitted to the camp nurse upon arrival.

MISCELLANEOUS:

- Bible Notebook & pen
- Flashlight (with extra batteries)
- Bug repellent
- Sunscreen
- Swim towel
- Umbrella or raincoat
- Reusable water bottle (with name)
- Battery operated fan (with extra batteries)
- Snacks, water, & drinks are permitted. These items are also available for purchase at the Snack Shack.

CABIN DECOR:

You can bring items to decorate your cabin for the week. These items must not be offensive in any manner. Decorations should align with the theme of the camp week i.e. Tropical themed decorations. Anything put up must not damage the campground property in any way. What is put up must come down at the end of the week. And remember, you are with young campers so do not bring something that you do not want to get damaged by accident. Make it welcoming and exciting for the campers.

WHAT TO BRING TO CAMP

DO NOT BRING:

- ❖ Distractions- such as video games, electronic devices
- ❖ Weapons of any kind (including pocket knives)
- ❖ Electronic Devices of any kind- handheld games, cellular watches, phones, etc.

NOTE: Phones will be permitted for each counselor as long as it is not a distraction from being engaged with your campers. If this becomes an issue, it will be addressed and you may be asked to turn your phone into the office for the remainder of camp week. Remember, you are there for the campers and you are an example.
